12.3	Review of the decision regarding Hillingdon Motion H1 at the 2015 National AGM	14.40 – 15.00
	In summary this motion was that groups may keep up to 50% of the membership fee. The motion appears in full in the appendices at the end of this document.	
	It was argued that this motion required only a simple majority because it does not amend the constitution, as the constitution does not state that groups must pay the full membership fee to their areas.	
	Detailed study of the constitution would suggest that the ruling given by the chairman regarding the majority needed for this motion was not correct.	
	The constitution has clearly been carefully worded in legal language. In several places it distinguishes between a specific fee and an unspecified fee.	
	In paras 10.1.3 and 10.2.4 of the Area Constitution the wording "the annual membership" fee is used where that specific fee is being referred to.	
	In Article 9: Finance of the Area Constitution the difference in usage is very clear –	

In Para 9.1.1 the wording is "The annual membership fee for Full Members shall be determined by the NEC of the Federation from time to time." "The" is used because it is referring to the specific fee.	
Para 9.1.2 the wording is "Nothing in this Constitution shall prevent a Member Group from setting an annual membership fee which is higher than that agreed by the NEC under this Article." "An" is used because it is referring to an unspecified amount, to be determined.	
Para 9.1.5 of the Area Constitution reads "Each Member Group shall submit an annual membership fee for each enrolled member to the Area Treasurer (or their representative) within seven days of receipt and in accordance with the internal procedures of the Area Committee." Again, "an" is used because it is referring to an unspecified amount, to be determined.	
So, both within the context of the wording of the rest of the constitution and normal English usage, the meaning of the constitution is quite clearly that groups must pay a membership fee to area, but it does not state that they have to pass on the full membership fee and no precise amount is specified in the constitution.	
Therefore it is asserted that the chairman's ruling was wrong and the motion only required a simple majority.	
Notwithstanding that -	
The decision was taken at the conference to allow constitution changes at 66%.	
The initial count of the vote was that it was exactly 66%. There was then a discussion in which it was suggested that $66 + 1$ % was required to pass. This is not correct – as the conference had agreed that a 66% majority was required for motions which made changes to the constitution, 66% was sufficient for it to have been recorded as passed.

	rtion to their membership. ("Total income from pership fees" means the full amount of the	

membership fee, including any part retained by the group.) The levy would be calculated as 25% of the membership fee income in the preceding year.	
To clarify any doubt about what the motion passed last year meant, the contribution should be 25% of income received – so for new members who are charged £10 the contribution will be £2.50 and for life embers it will be nil because no income has been received from them in the proceeding year.	
This would be the compulsory element of the levy; areas could pay more if they elected to do so. This would provide sufficient funds for NEC to hold meetings and pay for insurance and website. Areas or Groups which are in a strong financial position may wish to help by supporting their members by contributing to their expenses for attending meetings.	
Other expenditure proposals, such as funding national holidays and training events, would be put to the areas. So, when the NEC wishes to authorise expenditure which exceeds their total income in the year from member area fees ("the levy"), any monies which areas or groups voluntarily contribute and any other income, such proposals shall be put to Areas for a vote on whether the expenditure should proceed and whether it should be funded by further contributions from Areas and Groups, from the National Reserves or by other means. The expenditure may proceed if the majority of Areas vote in favour.	
This is not an amendment to the constitution; it is simply a resolution to set the levy for the coming year and a mandate to the NEC on how they should act for the coming year. It can be reviewed and revised at the next National AGM	
Motion H6 – To Reverse the Decision to Allow Project Officers to Vote on NEC	
This was proposed from the floor at the National AGM last year. It was passed perhaps without the full consideration it should have had. It is felt that it is wrong. The area chairs represent their members. The project officers have no mandate to represent	
anybody. Therefore it cannot be right that they could potentially outvote area chairs representing their members. Therefore it is proposed this change be reversed and only area chairs to have a vote.	

The Constitution to return to what it was on this matter before the National AGM last year. As this motion was passed last year on a 66% majority it should require only a 66% majority to reverse it. (This motion should proceed even if special measures have been implemented, as it is still necessary to correct the constitution.)	
<b>Motion H1 -</b> That groups may keep up to 50% of the membership fee.	
If it has not been confirmed that this motion was carried last year, then it is proposed again, as below in the appendices.	
Appendices	
Motions which were proposed at the 2015 National AGM –	
Motion H1	
The outcome of Motion H1 below is disputed.	
Motion H1 - That groups may keep up to 50% of the membership fee.	
This is to enable groups to have direct access to funds for marketing, development and events, and so assist them to grow.	
The proposal is that paying 50% of membership fee income to Area will be a minimum. Some groups have very healthy bank accounts and have other ways of raising money too, and so have no need of the membership income. They will be free to continue to contribute as much of membership fee income as they wish to their Area and can carry on contributing 100% if they elect to do so.	
It is asserted that this motion requires a simple majority and does not require an amendment to the constitution.	
Article 9.1.5 of the Model Area Constitution currently reads –	
Each Member Group shall submit an annual membership fee for each enrolled member to the Area Treasurer (or their representative) within seven days of receipt and in accordance with the internal procedures of the Area Committee.	

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It does not say " <b>the</b> annual membership fee" which would imply it meant the full fee. As it is, the amount of the fee to be submitted to the Area Treasurer is not specified.		
This motion is that the following be incorporated into the Standing Orders –		
Each Member Group shall submit at least one half of the annual membership fee for each enrolled member to the Area Treasurer (or their representative). Groups may elect to submit more than half. The remainder of the annual membership fee shall be retained by the group. If the meeting should take the view that "an annual membership fee" means "the full annual membership fee", then this motion is that the Model Area Constitution be amended as follows:		
Article 9.1.5 to read:		
Each Member Group shall submit at least one half of the annual membership fee for each enrolled member to the Area Treasurer (or their representative) within seven days of receipt and in accordance with the internal procedures of the Area Committee. Groups may elect to submit more than half. The remainder of the annual membership fee shall be retained by the group.		
Motion H3		
Motion H3 below was passed at the 2015 National AGM.		
<b>Motion H3 -</b> That the requirement for committees to hold a specific number of meetings per year be removed from the constitution and that only such meetings as are necessary and practical within available budget should be held. Also, that wherever possible matters should be agreed by email or other electronic discussion to avoid the cost of a meeting.		
Our constitution is written for an organisation of thousands of members, but we now have only a few hundred. The number and the cost of meetings being held are excessive for the size and income of the organisation now. The money being spent on		
meetings means that funds are not available for marketing, development and events, which is contributing to the further decline of the organisation		

This motion amends the constitution so as to reduce and control costs, as well as enabling the federation to move forward to more modern and effective methods of discussion. However, the amendments are worded so as not to preclude the possibility that we might recover and go back to a full programme of meetings in the future. The main focus of this motion is the cost of national meetings, however similar amendments regarding area meetings are also included, mainly because the member groups of the NGA (Non-Geographic Area) will be all over the country and it may not be practical to hold more than one area meeting or conference per year. But the amendments also allow the other areas to reduce the number of meetings and therefore cost if necessary. This requires that the National Constitution be amended as follows: Article 3.3.6 to read: Each Area shall hold at least one conference per year. Areas may hold such other conferences as are necessary and practical within available budget. Electronic discussion and electronic voting using an agreed system shall be recognised as having the same status as meetings or conferences held in person. Article 3.3.7 to be deleted Article 8.1 to be amended to read: The NEC shall hold such other meetings as are necessary and practical within available budget (hereinafter called "NEC Meetings"). Electronic discussion and electronic voting using an agreed system shall be recognised as having the same status as meetings held in person. And that the Model Area Constitution be amended as follows: Article 4.4 to be amended to read:

	The Area Chairman shall be a full member of one of the Member Groups within the Area (hereinafter called "the Member Groups"). The term of office for the Area Chairman will be one year in duration, elections to take place at the <i>Annual Conference of</i> <i>the Area</i> and the term of office will start on the 1st day of the month following the National AGM.	
	Article 13.1 to be amended to read:	
	Each Area shall hold at least one conference per year which shall be the Annual Conference of the Area. Areas may hold such other conferences as are necessary and practical within available budget. Electronic discussion and electronic voting using an agreed system shall be recognised as having the same status as meetings or conferences held in person.	
	Articles 13.1.1 to 13.1.2 inclusive to be deleted
